## **Intention of the Pope**

### **For formation in discernment.**

Let us pray that we might again learn how to discern, to know how to choose paths of life and reject everything that leads us away from Christ and the Gospel.

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## Pope's Message

Dear brothers and sisters,

You are my hope (cf. Ps 71:5)

1. "You, O Lord, are my hope" (Ps 71:5). These words well up from a heart burdened by grave hardship: "You have made me see many troubles and calamities" (v. 20), the Psalmist exclaims. At the same time, his heart remains open and confident; steadfast in faith, he acknowledges the support of God, whom he calls "a rock of refuge, a strong fortress" (v. 3). Hence, his abiding trust that hope in God never disappoints: "In you, Lord, I take refuge; I shall never be put to shame" (v. 1).

Amid life's trials, our hope is inspired by the firm and reassuring certainty of God's love, poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit. That hope does not disappoint (cf. Rom 5:5). Thus Saint Paul could write to Timothy: "To this end we toil and struggle, because we have our hope set on the living God" (1 Tim 4:10). The living God is in fact "the God of hope" (Rom 15:13), and Christ, by his death and resurrection, has himself become "our hope" (1 Tim 1:1). We must never forget that we were saved in this hope, and need to remain firmly rooted therein.

2. The poor can be witnesses to a strong and steadfast hope, precisely because they embody it in the midst of uncertainty, poverty, instability and marginalization. They cannot rely on the security of power and possessions; on the contrary, they are at their mercy and often victims of them. Their hope must necessarily be sought elsewhere. By recognizing that God is our first and only hope, we too pass from fleeting hopes to a lasting hope. Once we desire that God accompany us on the journey of life, material wealth becomes relativized, for we discover the real treasure that we need. The words that the Lord Jesus spoke to his disciples remain forceful and clear: "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consume and where thieves do not break in and steal" (Mt 6:19-20).

3. The gravest form of poverty is not to know God. As Pope Francis wrote in *Evangelii Gaudium*: “The worst discrimination which the poor suffer is the lack of spiritual care. The great majority of the poor have a special openness to the faith; they need God and we must not fail to offer them his friendship, his blessing, his word, the celebration of the sacraments and a journey of growth and maturity in the faith” (No. 2000). Here we see a basic and essential awareness of how we can find our treasure in God. As the Apostle John insists: “If anyone says, ‘I love God,’ but hates his brother, he is a liar; for whoever does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen” (1 Jn 4:20).

This is a rule of faith and the secret of hope: all this earth's goods, material realities, worldly pleasures, economic prosperity, however important, cannot bring happiness to our hearts. Wealth often disappoints and can lead to tragic situations of poverty — above all the poverty born of the failure to recognize our need for God and of the attempt to live without him. A saying of Saint Augustine comes to mind: “Let all your hope be in God: feel your need for him, and let him fill that need. Without him, whatever you possess will only make you all the emptier” (Enarr. in Ps., 85:3).

4. The word of God tells us that Christian hope is certainty at every step of life's journey, since it does not depend not on our human strength but upon the promise of God, who is always faithful. For this reason, from the beginning, Christians have identified hope with the symbol of the anchor, which provides stability and security. Christian hope is like an anchor that grounds our hearts in the promise of the Lord Jesus, who saved us by his death and resurrection and will come again among us. This hope continues to point us toward the “new heavens” and the “new earth” (2 Pet 3:13) as the true horizon of our existence, where every life will find its authentic meaning, for our real homeland is in heaven (cf. Phil 3:20).

The city of God, therefore, impels us to improve the cities of men and women. Our own cities must begin to resemble his. Hope, sustained by God's love poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit (cf. Rom 5:5), turns human hearts into fertile soil



where charity for the life of the world can blossom. The Church's tradition has constantly insisted on the circular relationship between the three theological virtues of faith, hope and charity. Hope is born of faith, which nourishes and sustains it on the foundation of charity, the mother of all virtues. All of us need charity, here and now. Charity is not just a promise; it is a present reality to be embraced with joy and responsibility. Charity engages us and guides our decisions towards the common good. Conversely, those who lack charity not only lack faith and hope; they also rob their neighbours of hope.

5. The biblical summons to hope thus entails the duty to shoulder our responsibilities in history, without hesitation. Charity, in fact, "is the greatest social commandment" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 1889). Poverty has structural causes that must be addressed and eliminated. In the meantime, each of us is called to offer new signs of hope that will bear witness to Christian charity, just as many saints have done over the centuries. Hospitals and schools, for instance, were institutions established to reach out to the most vulnerable and marginalized. These institutions should be a part of every country's public policy, yet wars and inequalities often prevent this from happening. Today, signs of hope are increasingly found in care homes, communities for minors, centres for listening and acceptance, soup kitchens, homeless shelters and low-income schools. How many of these quiet signs of hope often go unnoticed and yet are so important for setting aside our indifference and inspiring others to become involved in various forms of volunteer work!

The poor are not a distraction for the Church, but our beloved brothers and sisters, for by their lives, their words and their wisdom, they put us in contact with the truth of the Gospel. The celebration of the World Day of the Poor is meant to remind our communities that the poor are at the heart of all our pastoral activity. This is true not only of the Church's charitable work, but also of the message that she celebrates and proclaims. God took on their poverty in order to enrich us through their voices, their stories and their faces. Every form of poverty, without exception, calls us to experience the Gospel concretely and to offer effective signs of hope.

6. This, then, is the invitation extended to us by this Jubilee celebration. It is no coincidence that the World Day of the Poor is celebrated towards the end of this year of grace. Once the Holy Door is closed, we are to cherish and share with others the divine gifts granted us throughout this entire year of prayer, conversion and witness. The poor are not recipients of our pastoral care, but creative subjects who challenge us to find novel ways of living out the Gospel today. In the face of new forms of impoverishment, we can risk becoming hardened and resigned. Each day we encounter poor or impoverished people. We too may have less than before and are losing what once seemed secure: a home, sufficient food for each day, access to healthcare and a good education, information, religious freedom and freedom of expression.

In this promotion of the common good, our social responsibility is grounded in God's creative act, which gives everyone a share in the goods of the earth. Like those goods, the fruits of human labour should be equally accessible to all. Helping the poor is a matter of justice before a question of charity. As Saint Augustine observed: "You give bread to a hungry person; but it would be better if none were hungry, so that you would have no need to give it away. You clothe the naked, but would that all were clothed and that there be no need for supply this lack" (In I Ioan., 8:5).

It is my hope, then, that this Jubilee Year will encourage the development of policies aimed at combatting forms of poverty both old and new, as well as implementing new initiatives to support and assist the poorest of the poor. Labor, education, housing and health are the foundations of a security that will never be attained by the use of arms. I express my appreciation for those initiatives that already exist, and for the efforts demonstrated daily on the international level by great numbers of men and women of good will.

Let us entrust ourselves to Mary Most Holy, Comforter of the Afflicted and, with her, let us raise a song of hope as we make our own the words of the Te Deum: "In you, O Lord, is our hope, and we shall never hope in vain."





## Bishop's Message

Dear Rev. Fathers, Religious and People of God,

We celebrate the feast of St. Thomas, one of the apostles, in this month of July. We are privileged and take pride in the fact that he preached the good tidings in our land in the first century and was interred in the cathedral of the archdiocese of Madras-Mylapore. It is believed that he baptized numerous persons and built a few churches in Kerala. Thomas had full trust in his Master and that was why when all the other apostles were afraid and hid themselves in the safety of a closed room, he dared to go out. The faith of Thomas was such that he was ever ready to die for his beloved Master. When Jesus was told about the illness of Lazarus and was setting out to Bethany in Judea, the other disciples were afraid and cautioned Jesus about the danger he would meet there. But Thomas boldly came forward and said, "Let us go and die with him" (Jn 11/7ff).

According to the tradition, he was martyred on 3 July in the year 72 at Little Mount in Chennai. As we are privileged to receive faith from him through the missionary activities of St. Thomas, now the responsibility is with us to proclaim the Gospel to the people. As the document *Ad Gentes*, it says that the Church by its nature is a missionary. Therefore, we who are her members should preach the Gospel far and wide of our areas. Though we have excellent infrastructures, we have not preached the message of Jesus to every one. Till today the last man at the corner of our area, has not heard about message of Christ. It means that we have not done our duty and failed to accomplish the mandate of Christ.

The best way to preach the Gospel is our exemplary life. In the apostolic exhortation, St. Paul VI in his *Evangelium Nuntiandi*, says, "Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses". May deep ardour of Thomas that burst forth into the call, "Let us also go and die with him" stir our hearts and urge us to a more personal faith and commitment as followers of Christ. May he intercede for us that our faith may never fail.

## Bible Commission

### **Bible Commission – Report on the First Class of the Seventh Cycle of Certificate Course**

The Bible Commission is pleased to announce that the First Class of the Seventh Cycle of the Certificate Course was successfully conducted on **22nd June 2025 at Jeeva Jyothi Ashram, Bishop's House, Coimbatore**. A total of **87 participants** attended this spiritually enriching session. The day commenced with the **enthronement of the Holy Bible**, marking a solemn and grace-filled beginning.

**Fr. A. L. Christopher Roach** initiated the session with thought-provoking questions designed to spark curiosity and engagement among the participants. In honor of the **1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea**, special emphasis was given to a thorough explanation of the Nicene Creed. The day's teachings explored profound theological themes, including:

- **God's salvific plan for humanity**
- **The innate human longing for God**
- **God's initiative in encountering mankind**

Key doctrines such as Divine Revelation, its various stages, and the distinction between **Public and Private Revelations** were clearly articulated. Participants were also introduced to the **deposit of faith** as transmitted through **Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition**, and the essential role of the **Magisterium** in authentically interpreting and safeguarding these truths.

Practical guidance was provided on **how to read the Bible**, along with insights into how the **Catholic Church venerates Sacred Scripture**. A commonly held misconception was addressed: the improper reference to Jesus as "Yesuappa." Drawing from **Trinitarian theology**, it was clarified that the title "Appa" (Father) pertains to **God the Father**, and not to **Jesus the Son**, who is the **Mediator and Redeemer**.

The queries session was conducted by **Fr. C. Lawrence**, who offered deep insights into the **meaning, richness, and significance of the Holy Bible**, while explaining the **unity between the Old and New Testaments** and the redemptive role of Jesus Christ.

## News from CMSSS

### Dear Fathers

#### **CMSSS Coordinators Undergo Digital and AI Training**

The Coimbatore Multipurpose Social Service Society (CMSSS) recently hosted a one-day training program for its field coordinators, focusing on digital understanding and the practical application of Artificial Intelligence in fieldwork.

The seminar, led by the CMSSS Director, included a hands-on, two-hour practical workshop. Participants learned to effectively utilize mobile phones and phone cameras for data collection, enhancing their field reporting capabilities. Key topics covered included how to create concise reports directly from the field and the streamlined process for submitting these reports to the main office. This initiative aims to equip coordinators with essential digital skills, improving efficiency and accuracy in their daily operations.

#### **CMSSS Compiles Government Scheme Information for Women's Groups**

Over the past week, the Coimbatore Multipurpose Social Service Society (CMSSS) undertook a dedicated effort to gather comprehensive information on various government schemes. Their team meticulously collected details from Collectorate and Taluk offices across their respective regions, focusing on schemes related to education, sanitation, children, families, agriculture, and health.

This extensive compilation will now be concisely presented and distributed to women's self-help groups (SHGs). The objective is to empower these groups with knowledge about available government assistance, enabling them to leverage these schemes for a better living and improved socio-economic conditions for themselves and their families. This initiative aims



to bridge the information gap and facilitate access to vital government support.

### **CHRISTIAN WOMEN ASSOCIATION**

A significant initiative was undertaken at the Collectorate with the submission of one lakh rupees to the Christian Women Association. This contribution is part of a scheme enabling the association to receive funds from the Collectorate for distribution among needy Christian women.

The essential documents of the deserving women were duly submitted to the Minorities Department, ensuring proper verification and transparent allocation of aid. This collaboration aims to provide crucial financial support, empowering vulnerable women within the Christian community.

### **CMSSS General Body Meeting**

A two-hour General Body Meeting of CMSSS was held on May 24, 2025, with all members in full attendance. The Director presented the Annual Report, highlighting the organization's achievements and challenges over the past year. Following the report, an engaging discussion took place, with members actively participating and offering valuable insights.



Key new decisions were collectively taken by the members, aiming to further strengthen CMSSS's mission. Crucially, the members unanimously approved the steps taken to bolster the safeguarding policies of CMSSS, which will undergo a renewal process. The Secretary of the



Board also submitted the auditing reports for the year 2024 and 2025 to the board for review. The meeting concluded successfully, followed by a communal lunch.

### **COLLABORATION OF CMSSS AND SAARC TRUST AT UDUMALPET:**

A collaborative meeting between CMSSS and SAARC Trust took place in Udumalpet, uniting women's self-help groups from the SAARC Trust with CMSSS initiatives. The Director of CMSSS elucidated the various schemes, rules, and regulations offered by CMSSS, providing valuable insights to the participating women. A significant outcome of the meeting was the selection of new coordinators from among the groups, who will now form the Udumalpet team. Approximately thirty women leaders actively participated in the day's proceedings, demonstrating strong engagement and a commitment to community development. Special gratitude was extended to the SAARC Trust leader for their instrumental role in facilitating this impactful collaboration.



### **ITALIAN BISHOP'S CONFERENCE**

#### **FORMATION OF NEW WOMEN'S SELF-HELP GROUPS**

In Coimbatore and Kinathukadavu regions, the Italian Bishop's Conference recently concluded a program focused on forming new women's self-help groups. Conducted for ten different groups across various areas, the initiative aimed to elucidate the benefits and importance of collective action. Field coordinators ran the program simply, explaining the positive impacts of group participation, including enhanced social support and economic empowerment. Each session concluded



with an interactive Q&A segment, allowing participants to clarify doubts and further understand the advantages of forming such groups. The program was well-received, fostering a sense of community and encouraging collaborative efforts among women in the region.

### **STRENGTHENING OF WOMEN'S SELF-HELP GROUPS**

The Italian Bishop's Conference and CMSSS recently conducted a program aimed at strengthening existing women's self-help groups across Coimbatore, Kinathukadavu, and Pollachi regions. The program, delivered in a simple and accessible manner by field coordinators, focused on reinforcing the benefits and importance of these groups for women's empowerment.



A key component of the sessions was practical guidance on money handling within the groups, explained with clear examples to ensure understanding. Participants engaged in



interactive Q&A sessions, openly discussing the pros and cons of their respective groups and sharing difficulties they encountered. This facilitated a collaborative problem-solving environment. The program reached ten different groups in



various areas, fostering improved financial management and solidarity among members.

### **NUTRITIOUS FOOD HABITS FOR CHILDREN**

The Italian Bishop's Conference, in collaboration with the Coimbatore Multipurpose Social Service Society, recently conducted a program on nutritious food habits for children in the Anamalai and Pollachi regions. Aimed at thirty children across two areas, the initiative utilized engaging methods like posters and games to demonstrate healthy eating.



Field coordinators explained the benefits and importance of good food habits, outlining a model daily schedule for the children to follow. Interactive Q&A sessions allowed children to discuss their current food habits and the difficulties they face in their families regarding nutrition. This direct engagement helped in understanding their challenges and promoting practical solutions for healthier eating within their households. The program successfully imparted crucial knowledge in a simple and impactful manner.

### **AWARENESS PROGRAM ON HEALTH AND HYGIENE**

The Italian Bishop's Conference, in collaboration with the Coimbatore Multipurpose Social Service Society, recently organized an awareness program on health and hygiene specifically for adolescent girls in the Kinathukadavu and Pollachi areas. This crucial initiative reached thirty girls, with field coordinators and a resource person providing detailed explanations on the importance of daily health and hygiene practices.



The program emphasized the significance of good habits in daily life, addressing practical aspects of personal care. A vital part of the initiative involved the distribution of sanitary pads to some underprivileged girls in need, promoting menstrual hygiene. Interactive Q&A sessions encouraged the girls to discuss their existing health



habits and openly share difficulties encountered within their families and schools, fostering a supportive environment for learning and addressing their concerns.

### **AWARENESS PROGRAM ON THE ILL EFFECTS OF OPEN DEFECACTION**

The Italian Bishop's Conference, in collaboration with the Coimbatore Multipurpose Social Service Society, organized a vital awareness program on the ill effects of open defecation for five Narikuravar family clusters in the Kinathukadavu and Pollachi regions. Led by area field coordinators and a resource person, the program detailed the critical importance of health and hygiene in daily life.



The sessions emphasized tips for maintaining a healthy and neat environment, encouraging a shift from open defecation practices. Interactive Q&A sessions provided a platform for families to discuss their existing bathroom facilities and the specific difficulties they faced within their families and premises regarding sanitation. This direct



engagement aimed to understand their challenges and collectively explore solutions for improved hygiene and well-being within the community.

Stephy on 01.06.2025. Thanks to the diocesan youth coordinator for sharing the view points to the youth team.

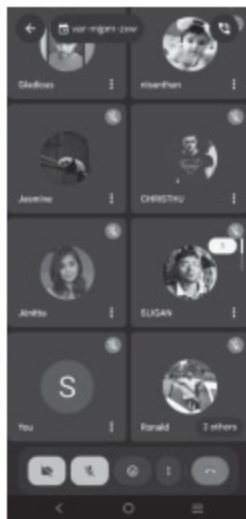

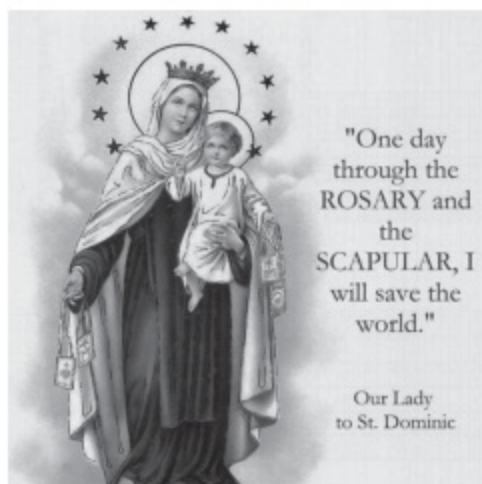
